# C.C.N.R. Annual Report 2010.

The Centre for Community Networking Research (www.ccnr.net), part of C.O.S.I. and the Caulfield School of Information Technology, at Monash University, aims to understand how communities and community organisations use new technologies effectively. It is interested in the practicalities of information and technology usage, why they are implemented, and how their usefulness is measured. At its heart lies a desire to develop social capital by means of Information and Communications Technologies (ICTs). Community and institutional culture are shaped through different understandings and adaptations of technologies. C.C.N.R. is linked to the International Development Informatics Association (http://www.developmentinformatics.org/).

The Centre is planning to hold its tenth self-funded annual conference at the Monash Prato Centre; Dr Larry Stillman has organised and managed them all. Most conferences have led to a set of published proceedings. Many research projects and local and international PhD students are based in the Centre (Anwar, Bakar, French, Plantinga, Ninh, Walton). The Centre typically uses grounded qualitative and quantitative research methods. Several projects have evaluated ICTs in a range of community contexts, and consultancies have been undertaken. The Centre is funded by grants from individual donors, community-based organisations, government, and business. This annual report details some of the year's achievements.
